

ANNOUNCEMENTS

UPDATE: Westminster has learned that three members of our church staff have tested positive for the COVID-19 virus, and other staff are awaiting test results. Based on CDC and state guidelines, the church offices will be closed until Wednesday, October 7, 2020. Also, the Session of Westminster voted to cancel all in-person worship services and all staff-led church activities that meet within our facilities until October 7. During that time, the church facilities will be deep-cleaned by a professional company.

Please watch for an email that will contain the details for accessing these services.

The new class of elders will begin their 3-year terms on May 1, 2021.
