

"PILGRIM'S PROGRESS THROUGH THE PANDEMIC: FROM COPING TO ADAPTING TO TRANSFORMING" –The first class in this 8-week series begins Sunday, October 25, at 9:45 a.m. "Ethical Tensions Moving Forward with the Pandemic," will be led by Prof. Kate Payne, a nurse, lawyer, and member of Vanderbilt's Center for Biomedical Ethics and Society. Dr. Payne will address how we get trapped in dualities of thinking: yes/no, black/white, man/woman, right/wrong, safety/fear, science/faith. This dualistic way of thinking and then making judgments has led to some very difficult and painful lessons during the present pandemic. Prof. Payne will explore a third way on how a biomedical ethicist works through uncertainty without being trapped in dualities which separate us from one another.
