SCRIPTURE AND SERMON

1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

5 Now concerning the times and the seasons, brothers and sisters, you do not need to have anything written to you. ² For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. ³ When they say, "There is peace and security," then sudden destruction will come upon them, as labor pains come upon a pregnant woman, and there will be no escape! ⁴But you, beloved, are not in darkness, for that day to surprise you like a thief; 5 for you are all children of light and children of the day; we are not of the night or of darkness. ⁶So then let us not fall asleep as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober; ⁷ for those who sleep at night, and those who are drunk get drunk at night. ⁸ But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, and put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation. 9 For God has destined us not for wrath but for obtaining salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, ¹⁰ who died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep we may live with him. ¹¹ Therefore encourage one another and build up each other, as indeed you are doing.

²² The same night he got up and took his two wives, his two maids, and his eleven children, and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. ²³ He took them and sent them across the stream, and likewise everything that he had. ²⁴ Jacob was left alone; and a man wrestled with him until daybreak. ²⁵ When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he struck him on the hip socket; and Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. ²⁶ Then he said, "Let me go, for the day is breaking." But Jacob said, "I will not let you go, unless you bless me." ²⁷ So he said to him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Jacob." 28 Then the man said, "You shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God and with humans, and have prevailed." 29 Then Jacob asked him, "Please tell me your name." But he said, "Why is it that you ask my name?" And there he blessed him. 30 So Jacob called the place Peniel, saying, "For I have seen God face to face, and yet my life is preserved." ³¹ The sun rose upon him as he passed Penuel, limping because of his hip. ³² Therefore to this day the Israelites do not eat the thigh muscle that is on the hip socket, because he struck Jacob on the hip socket at the thigh muscle.

BREAKING OF THE BREAD

The Lord Jesus, on the night of his arrest, took bread, and after giving thanks to God, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: "Take, eat.

COMMUNION OF THE PEOPLE

Gather communion elements of bread and wine, such as crackers, tortillas, pita bread, or bagels; and juice, water, or soda — all are fine. Set out worshipful elements such as a white cloth, cross, candle, and Bible. If you are gathered with others, please serve one another communion, offering the elements with words such as, "This is the bread of life" and "This is the cup of salvation." If you are alone, know that others are sharing this meal with you, and that we are all part of the body of Christ whether we receive in solitude or with others.

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

God of grace, you renew us at your table with the bread of life. May this food strengthen us in love and help us to serve you in each other. We ask this in the name of Jesus the Lord. **Amen.**







CONFIRMATION is a rite that has been celebrated in the Christian Church since the second century. Originally, it was when the Holy Spirit was imparted on believers, following Baptism. Since the Middle Ages, churches have understood Confirmation as a rite that concludes a period of instruction of young people who had made a public profession of faith and had been baptized. Westminster has a two-year Confirmation ministry that begins in the seventh grade and concludes at the end of the youth's eighth-grade year. During these two years the youth learn about the Trinity, the Bible, the church, the sacraments, and what it means to be a Presbyterian. We celebrate with them this morning on their Confirmation, which is a significant moment in their faith journeys.

THE BAPTISMAL RITE

The Apostles' Creed: The oldest surviving baptismal liturgy, dating from around the year 200 C.E., describes the candidate for baptism standing in water and affirming the faith by responding to three questions. Each question corresponds to one person of the Trinity. The Paschal Candle is symbolic of Christ's death and resurrection. The Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world, is our Paschal sacrifice. The Paschal Candle also symbolizes the light of the risen Christ, shining in the world. The use of this symbol dates from the early days of the Church. New Christians were given a lighted candle, symbolic of their having died and been raised to new life in Christ through baptism. Each family is given a Paschal Candle to use annually on the anniversary of the baptism as a symbolic reminder of God's gift of redemption and new life in Jesus Christ.

The sacrament of baptism will be administered today at the 8:30 a.m. worship service to

"PILGRIM'S PROGRESS THROUGH PANDEMIC: From Coping to Adapting to Transforming' continues on Sunday mornings, 9:45 – 10:45 a.m. via Zoom. The class for November 15 will be, "Religious Responses to Recent and **Epidemics:** The 1918-22 Flu Pandemic, Polio, The speaker will be Dr. James Hudnut-Beumler, professor of AIDS/HIV." American Religious History and former dean, Vanderbilt Divinity School. This class will help us to see the possibilities and problems in our current situation more clearly by looking at prior cases and asking ourselves, "How do our responses now compare to what people of faith did in similar, earlier moments of challenge?" Pandemics throughout human history are manifold, but three 20th century pandemics and epidemics perhaps speak most directly to Americans living through COVID-19. The 1918-22 Flu Pandemic, Polio in the 1950s, and AIDS/HIV in the 1980s each hold up the mirror of history to the religious dimensions of responding to an unwanted mass health crisis. Cumulatively, they help pose important questions for what we should think, do, and pray for now.
