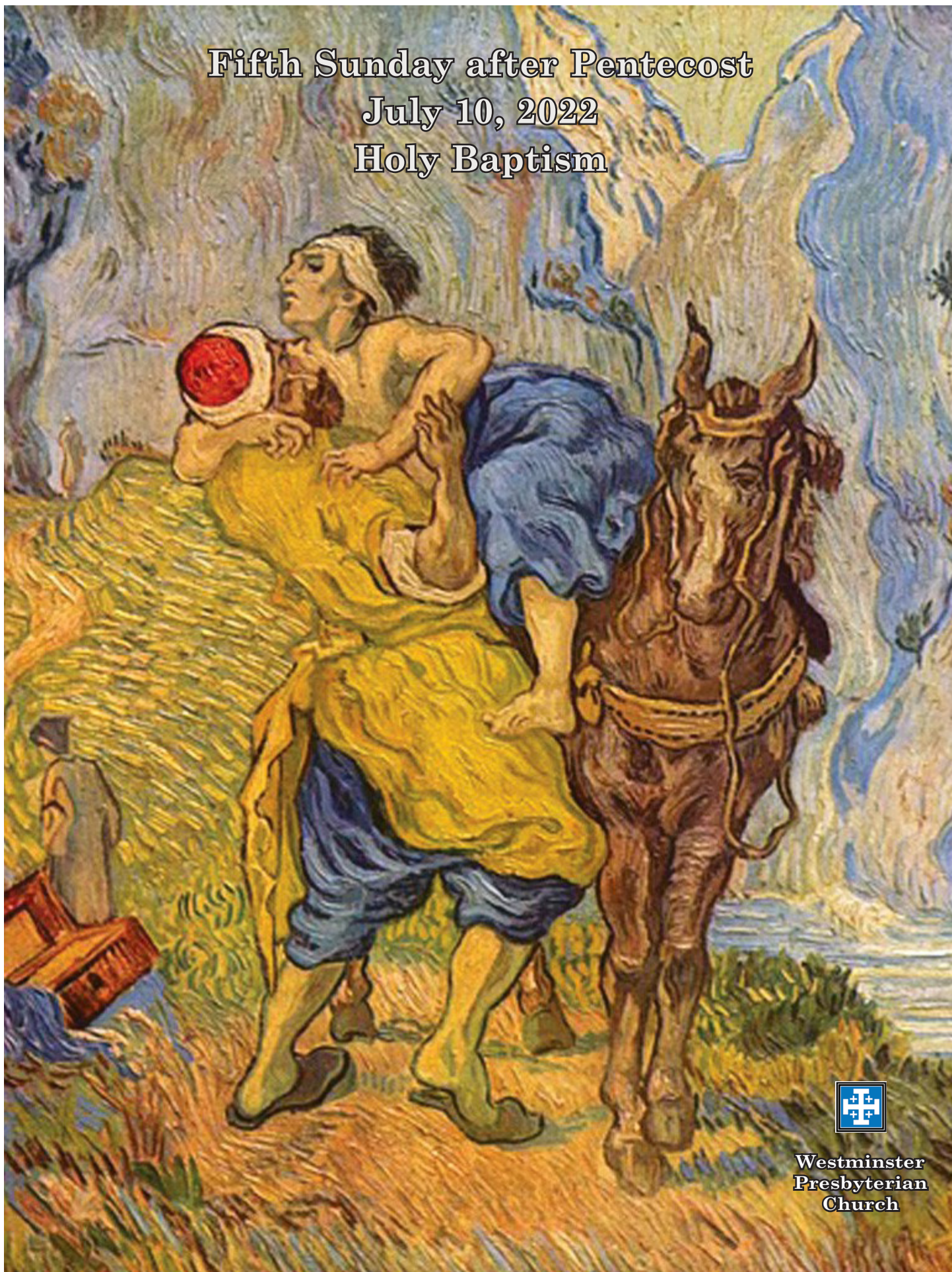

About the Prelude

The Prelude is a musical offering to help move the hearts and minds of the gathering community from the daily struggles of life to the worship of God. Bach emulates French, Italian, and German styles in this large-scale Prelude. The first section resembles an Overture with marching, dotted rhythms, followed by sections with echoes and solo melody with accompaniment, as well as sections with fugal writing.

About Hymn 624

The original French text, sometimes attributed to John Calvin, seems to be a Protestant reworking of a Roman Catholic hymn, not a typical practice for him. Yet this text and tune (adapted from GENEVAN 124) clearly date from the early years of the Reformed tradition.

Having praised the holiness of God, we must also face the errant state of the world and of our lives, confessing our unworthiness to enter into God's presence. Nevertheless, we approach God with confidence, trusting in the mercy of Jesus Christ. This turn from communal praise to corporate confession, established on the promise of God's grace, is one of the hallmarks of the Reformed tradition.

*Assurance of
Pardon*

A declaration of forgiveness proclaims the good news of God's mercy and offers the assurance of pardon in Jesus' name. The liturgist pours water into the font, which reminds us of the grace and cleansing of our Baptism, and the baptismal call to new life in Christ.

The Act of Praise brings together the choir and congregation to sing God's praise.

The Baptismal Rite

The Apostles' Creed: The oldest surviving baptismal liturgy, dating from around the year 200 C.E., describes the candidate for baptism standing in water and affirming the faith by responding to three questions. Each question corresponds to one person of the Trinity. The Paschal Candle is symbolic of Christ's death and resurrection. The Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world, is our Paschal sacrifice. The Paschal Candle also symbolizes the light of the risen Christ, shining in the world. The use of this symbol dates from the early days of the Church. New Christians were given a lighted candle, symbolic of their having died and been raised to new life in Christ through baptism.

This poignant text by Carl P. Daw, Jr. is set to an elegant new tune, MISSISSIPPI, by composer William Bradley Roberts. This hymn was written for the Mississippi Conference on Music & Liturgy (Episcopal) in 1993; a conference that has been meeting for one week every year for the past 46 years in Jackson. This hymn can be summarized with its title's quotation from Matthew 25, but it also includes a roster of several other Bible stories. While the parable of the Good Samaritan read from Luke 10 today is not directly quoted in this hymn, its message is the same: "When was it, Lord, that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? When was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing?... Jesus responds "Just as you did it to one of the least of these, you did it to me."

About Hymn 63

This hymn paraphrases the *Shema* (Deuteronomy 6:4-9), an ancient and central affirmation of Jewish monotheistic faith that observant Jews still recite twice a day. Jesus knew it well and called it the first and great commandment (Matthew 22:38/ Mark 12:28-29 / Luke 10:26-28).

About the Postlude

The Postlude is considered the final Alleluia of worship. The subject of this Fugue sounds much like the melody of "O God Our Help in Ages Past." Although new figurations are introduced in the second and third sections, you can hear the main subject overlaid with the new material each time.
