Call to and Prayer of Confession

It is a valuable and formative experience in one's faith journey, where Confirmands are encouraged to answer the question: "Why be a part of the Church?" We celebrate with the Confirmands this morning as they publicly profess their faith and assume greater responsibility in the life of the Church as well as God's mission in the world. This is a significant moment in their faith journeys!



The prayer ends with praise to the triune God.





Following the program, a box lunch will be served. Everyone is welcome for the program. Reservations are required to stay for lunch. Cost \$10. Contact the office.








