PSALM 91: 1-6, 9-12

You who dwell in the shelter of the Most High, who abide under the shadow of the Almighty.

You shall say to the Lord, "You are my refuge and my stronghold, my God in whom I put my trust."

God shall deliver you from the snare of the hunter and from the deadly pestilence.

God's pinions will cover you, and you shall find refuge under the wings of the Lord, whose faithfulness shall be your shield and defense.

You shall not be afraid of any terror by night, nor of any arrow that flies by day;

nor the plague that stalks in the darkness, nor of the sickness that lays waste at mid-day.

Because you have made the Lord your refuge, and the Most High your habitation,

SCRIPTURE

I John 4: 7-21

⁷Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. ⁸Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. ⁹God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. ¹⁰In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. ¹¹Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. ¹²No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us.

¹³ By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. ¹⁴ And we have seen and do testify that the Father has sent his Son as the Savior of the world. ¹⁵ God abides in those who confess that Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God. ¹⁶ So we have known and believe the love that God has for us.

God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. ¹⁷ Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness on the day of judgment, because as he is, so are we in this world. ¹⁸ There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. ¹⁹ We love because he first loved us. ²⁰ Those who say, "I love God," and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. ²¹ The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also.

LENTEN PRAYER OF APPROACH TO GOD

O God the Creator of heaven and earth, our Eternal Parent, Have mercy on us. O God, the Son, redeemer of the world, Have mercy on us. Holy, blessed, and glorious Trinity, three persons and one God, Have mercy on us.

We come before you now, God, with grateful and thankful hearts. Hear our prayers of praise and thanksgiving, for all your gifts, all your promises, all your blessings. Amen.

Lord Jesus, You are above us – reigning. You are in us – living. We are your temple not made with hands. We are your body. If every wall should crumble, and every church decay, we are your habitation. Nearer are you than breathing, closer than hands and feet. Ours are the eyes with which you, in the mystery, look out in compassion on the world.

We come before you now, God, for we are hurting for ourselves, for those we love, for the world. Hear our prayers of supplication and intercession, poured out at the foot of your cross.
