#### About the Cover

The Hireling Shepherd (18851) is a painting by the English pre-Raphaelite artist William Holman Hunt. It represents a shepherd neglecting his flock in favor of an attractive country girl to whom he shows a deaths-head hawkmoth. Hunt suggested that the painting is allegorical and a critique on the Church of England of his day. He elaborated this claim in a letter when the painting was acquired by Manchester Art Gallery asserting that he intended the couple to symbolize the pointless theological debates which occupied church leaders while their "flock" went astray due to a lack of pastoral guidance and care. One can see just the head of one of the black-headed Shropshire Sheep wandering off in the high grain in the top left of the painting. This would make the title, The Hireling Shepherd, a biblical allusion; in the story of the Good Shepherd (King James version) the Good Shepherd is explicitly contrasted with a hireling shepherd who has no care for the sheep. (John 10:11-15)

#### One compelling loyalty

The term *shepherd* is political in the Bible. It means king, sovereign, lord, authority, the one who directs, to whom I am answerable, whom I trust and serve. In this simple opening line, the psalm [Psalm 23] is clear about the goal and focus, the center and purpose of life: Yahweh and no other. There is no rival loyalty, no competing claim - not economic or political, not liberal or conservative, not sexist or racist, nor any of the other petty loyalties that seduce us. It is a mark of discernment and maturity to strip life down to one compelling loyalty, to be freed of all the others that turn out to be idolatrous.

About Hymn 394

Although this ancient text has often been used at church dedications, the first stanza clearly refers to the people of God and the second to the place where they meet. The stately and soaring tune is aptly named for the edifice where the composer served as organist and is buried. TEXT: Latin, 7th cent.; trans. John Mason Neale, 1851; MUSIC: Henry Purcell, c. 1680.

Call to and Prayer of Confession

A call to confession expresses God's initiative in calling for repentance and vowing forgiveness in Christ. As members of Christ's body, we confess the reality of sin, captivity, and brokenness in personal and common life and ask for God's saving grace.

About the Kyrie

The Kyrie (Greek "kyrios" [Lord]) is a corporate musical prayer for grace.

#### Assurance of Pardon

A declaration of forgiveness proclaims the good news of God's mercy and offers the assurance of pardon in Jesus' name. The liturgist pours water into the font, which reminds us of the grace and cleansing of our Baptism, and the baptismal call to new life in Christ.

#### Act of Praise

The Act of Praise brings together the choir and congregation to sing God's praise in response to the Assurance of Pardon as the last phrase.

#### Prayer for Illumination

A Prayer for Illumination calls on the Holy Spirit to empower the reading, understanding, proclaiming, and living of God's word. This sense of utter reliance on the illumination of the Spirit is an important and distinctive mark of the Reformed tradition.






