Reconcile

God has blessed me with some skills and a brain that still works, and I figure I gotta use it. I use it for people that I know and care about in many ways, but I also think I have to reach out to those people who are in our city. We have thousands of immigrants who are most challenged by what I do. They are used to coming from countries where they could get healthcare no matter what their income was – even if they had no income. That's not true here.

I worked with an 84-year-old woman who was denied Tenncare not because she wasn't eligible but because she wasn't able to figure out a letter and tell what document was missing. The lady had all her paperwork at home, so she brought it to the office, and we had it all figured out within thirty minutes. She said "God sent you to me..."



I asked Lentz Health Center if I could begin working there as a volunteer once a week for a couple of hours. During the pandemic, I learned I could do a lot of this over the telephone. It's all about the documents. Most people don't know what to do with them. It's pretty simple if you know the guidelines, but if you don't know, it's like a puzzle you can't solve.





Then I learned in January 1976, my mother had terminal breast cancer that spread to her lungs. I lost her in October.
