Worship on the Lord's Day

Worship begins as the people gather - greeting one another, praying in silence, or offering music to the glory of God. The act of assembling in Jesus' name bears witness to the Church's identity and mission as Christ's body in the world.

About Hymn 41

Addressing the first two stanzas to the singers of the hymn and the last three to God, this free paraphrase of Psalm 104 recasts the psalmist's imagery with baroque verve. Though it was first published in England, the tune has been more popular in North America than there. TEXT: Robert Grant, 1833; MUSIC: Joseph Martin Kraus, 1784.

Call to and Prayer of Confession

This turn from communal praise to corporate confession, established on the promise of God's grace, is one of the hallmarks of the Reformed tradition.

About the Kyrie

The Kyrie (Greek "kyrios" [Lord]) is a corporate musical prayer for grace.

Assurance of Pardon

A declaration of forgiveness proclaims the good news of God's mercy and offers the assurance of pardon in Jesus' name. The liturgist pours water into the font, which reminds us of the grace and cleansing of our Baptism, and the baptismal call to new life in Christ.

Act of Praise

The Act of Praise brings together the choir and congregation to sing God's praise in response to the Assurance of Pardon as the last phrase.

These words are set to a 16thcentury psalm tune that has been effective with many texts. TEXT: The New Metrical Version of the Psalms, 1909, alt.; MUSIC: Day's Psalter, 1562.

About Hymn 629

The sweetness celebrated in this anonymous 12thcentury Latin poem is not cloying or sentimental; it is more like an antidote to bitterness and a source of hope and healing. The best-known 19thcentury translation is set here to a tune composed especially for these words. TEXT: Latin hymn, 12th cent.; trans. Édward Caswall, 1849; MUSIC: John Bacchus Dykes, 1866,

About "I Believe"

The anonymous words of *I Believe* were scrawled on a cellar wall where Jews had hidden in Cologne, Germany during World War II. They have come to symbolize hope in the face of the despairing circumstances of the Holocaust. The composer says: "I composed this as a testament to the power of love over institutionalized hate. whether it comes from government or religion. Several years ago I came upon this poem at a difficult time in my life when I was searching for words to embody the pain I was feeling and the hope I was needing. There are rare moments when composing is more like an uncovering of something that was already there - this piece emerged within a few minutes and became a solace and an antidote for my world weariness. My hope is for this sacred gift of lyrics and song to be 'medicine for the soul' for all who hear



Christianity, Mass Incarceration, and Transformative Justice

The last 50 years of institutional punishment, described as Mass Incarceration, have shown that punishment as retribution through incapacitation neither deters crime, rehabilitates offenders, nor satisfies the offended as declared. Christian practices of restorative and transformative justice offer alternative models

of punishment that place persons in communities, communities in systems, and systems in accountability to human flourishing. We will examine in one short hour the vision of justice in scripture, the history of penal justice in America, and the role of transformative justice in punishment and restoration, as well as our faith-obligated place in them.
