Call to and Prayer of Confession

A call to confession expresses God's initiative in calling for repentance and promising forgiveness in Christ. As members of Christ's body, we confess the reality of sin, captivity, and brokenness in personal and common life and ask for God's saving grace.

About the Kyrie

The Kyrie (Greek "kyrios" [Lord]) is a corporate musical prayer for grace.

Assurance of Pardon

A declaration of forgiveness proclaims the good news of God's mercy and offers the assurance of pardon in Jesus' name. The liturgist pours water into the font, which reminds us of the grace and cleansing of our Baptism, and the baptismal call to new life in Christ.

Act of Praise

The Act of Praise brings together the choir and congregation to sing God's praise in response to the Assurance of Pardon as the last phrase.

Children's Time will happen at both services when we do not have communion or baptisms.

Scripture

The scriptures bear witness to the word of God, revealed most fully in Jesus Christ, the Word who "became flesh and lived among us." (John 1:14) Where the word is read and proclaimed, Jesus Christ the living Word is present by the power of the Holy Spirit. Therefore, reading, hearing, preaching, and affirming the word are central to Christian worship and essential to the Service for the Lord's Day.

An architect, urban designer, visual artist, historian, public speaker, and author, Kem was born in Nashville and raised in nearby Murfreesboro. He received the Bachelor of Architecture degree from the University of Tennessee (recipient of Torchbearer Award) and Master of Architecture degree from the University of Pennsylvania and the Ecole des Beaux-Arts in Paris. During his 35-year career with Tuck-

Hinton Architects, Kem was responsible for the design of educational facilities, private homes, theaters, museums, churches, parks, and memorials. Award-winning structures designed by their firm include the Country Music Hall of Fame, Frist Art Museum, Nashville Public Square, Girl Scout Center, Woodmont Hills Church of Christ, Tennessee Aquarium IMAX Center. Kem's most known accomplishments as lead designer are the Tennessee Bicentennial Mall, Civil Rights Room and Votes for Women Room (both in the Nashville Public Library), Tennessee World War II Memorial, and Tennessee State Library & Archives. He brings his keen architectural eye to the temples of Egypt and puts them in historical conversation with the Biblical story from both the Old and New Testaments.
