About the Prelude

The Prelude is a musical offering to help move the hearts and minds of the gathering community from the daily struggles of life to the worship of God.

The final piece in E from Franck's collection recalls the themes from the preceding pieces. The key quality of some themes are reversed (major to minor/minor to major) and the Prière (the last of the three pieces in E minor) is highlighted by its multiple appearances.

Worship on the Lord's Day

Worship begins as the people gather - greeting one another, praying in silence, or offering music to the glory of God. The act of assembling in Jesus' name bears witness to the Church's identity and mission as Christ's body in the world.



Call to and Prayer of Confession

A call to confession expresses God's initiative in calling for repentance and promising forgiveness in Christ. As members of Christ's body, we confess the reality of sin, captivity, and brokenness in personal and common life and ask for God's saving grace.

About the Kyrie

The Kyrie (Greek "kyrios" [Lord]) is a corporate musical prayer for grace.

For the Beauty of the Earth 14



In the course of many revisions, the original eucharistic emphasis of this text has shifted to a hymn of thanksgiving for a wide range of human experience, with a Christological summation. It is set here to the tune that is customary in North America, though not elsewhere.

Assurance of Pardon

A declaration of forgiveness proclaims the good news of God's mercy and offers the assurance of pardon in Jesus' name. The liturgist pours water into the font, which reminds us of the grace and cleansing of our Baptism, and the baptismal call to new life in Christ.

Act of Praise

The Act of Praise brings together the choir and congregation to sing God's praise in response to the Assurance of Pardon

Prayer for Illumination

A Prayer for Illumination calls on the Holy Spirit to empower the reading, understanding, proclaiming, and living of God's word. This sense of utter reliance on the illumination of the Spirit is an important and distinctive mark of the Reformed tradition.

This class is an opportunity to discuss these questions as a community of faith.






W. Somerset Maugham was one of the 20th century's great British novelists, and Of Human Bondage was his masterpiece. It's a highly autobiographical and deeply humane portrait of a young man's search for meaning, filled with instantly memorable characters and scenes from European life at the turn of the century--Paris in the throes of the impressionist craze, London from the slums to the ballrooms of the good and the great. The book is also, and perhaps most importantly, a sustained meditation on what is truly good and worthwhile in life. That's the theme we'll be focusing on in this class.

Maugham's alter-ego, Philip Carey, tries on all sorts of ways of looking at the world, coping with its suffering and injustice, and finally loving what is best in it. As Christians, we'll find many of the approaches Philip takes resonant, exciting, and challenging by turns. Over the course of three discussions, we'll read the novel together and explore how its portrayal of frustrated love and ultimate fulfillment can help us understand our own calling.

Spencer A. Klavan is a writer, lecturer, and podcaster. He holds a Ph.D. in Classics from Oxford University, and he teaches Greek literature at the college level. His latest book, Light of the Mind, Light of the World, is an exploration of the history of science from a religious perspective. He and his husband, Josh, are members at Westminster.

My Side of the River: A Memoir by Elizabeth Camarillo Gutierrez

Presenter: Guy D. Griffith

Elizabeth Camarillo Gutierrez was born and raised in Tucson, Arizona, as the daughter of Mexican citizens who periodically lived and worked as immigrants in the United States. As her parents' visas expired, they were forced to return to Mexico, leaving Elizabeth responsible for her younger brother, as well as her education. Armed with only her passport and sheer teenage determination, Elizabeth became what her school would eventually describe as an unaccompanied, homeless youth, one of thousands of underage victims affected by family separation. Her memoir relates the impact of law and U.S. immigration policy which encouraged seasonal labor but separated families like hers.
