A call to confession expresses God's initiative in calling for repentance and promising forgiveness in Christ. As members of Christ's body, we confess the reality of sin, captivity, and brokenness in personal and common life and ask for God's saving grace.

About the Kyrie
The Kyrie (Greek "kyrios" [Lord]) is a corporate musical prayer for grace.

Assurance of Pardon

A declaration of forgiveness proclaims the good news of God's mercy and offers the assurance of pardon in Jesus' name. The liturgist pours water into the font, which reminds us of the grace and cleansing of our Baptism, and the baptismal call to new life in Christ.

The Act of Praise brings together the choir and congregation to sing God’s praise in response to the Assurance of Pardon as the last phrase.

Children’s Time will happen at both services when we do not have communion or baptisms.

This school year, we are focusing on the theme “Taste and See that the Lord is Good!” Psalm 34:8. The goal of this focus is for all of us to up our game, or as Paul urges us, “Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern the will of God.” We hope that we will all step out in faith. Today’s scripture implores us to act like Jesus. The question is: will you hear the Word of God?

Although several passages in the Psalms come close to the wording of this refrain, none matches it exactly. The refrain serves as a summation of the stanzas, each of which is filled with multiple instances of God's providential mercy, and all of them are worth pondering.

***AFFIRMATION OF FAITH**

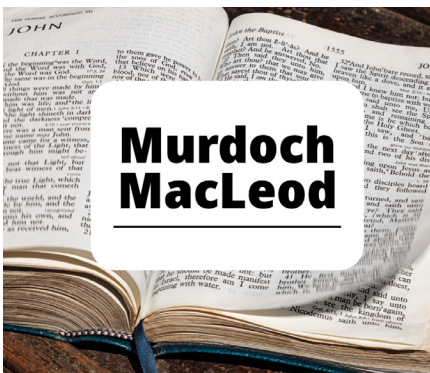


Covenant Conversation with Lee C. Camp
